- 8. How can building relationships with people from a different race help you better understand the issues that matter most to them?
- 9. Have you ever experienced a change in your perspective because of a relationship you had with someone who was from a different race than you? Discuss.
- 10. What does it mean to love your neighbor as yourself?
- 11. Who does Jesus say is your neighbor?
- 12. What would happen if you embraced the call to radically love your neighbors?
- 13. What would change in your life if you embraced the reconciliation as part of your responsibility as a follower of Jesus?
