- 7. When have you questioned God in the midst of suffering? How might it strengthen your faith to know that the Bible includes the questions of people who suffer?
- 8. What is important about the truth that suffering and silence do not indicate God's absence?
- 9. How can God leverage your pain and suffering to help you better understand His love and grace?
- 10. How does the Good News of Jesus provide hope that suffering is not ultimate?
