- 1. It seems like the church has a difficult time talking about mental illness. Why is that?

- 3. How does hearing the rest of Elijah's story effect your life and walk with Jesus today?
- 4. A change came in Elijah's life when his was driven by fear and not faith. (I Kings 19:3) What are some spiritual principles you have applied when you encounter controlling fear in your life?
- 5. Elijah felt he had had enough. He could do not more. (I Kings 19:4) Does God give us more than we can handle? What key point was Jesus making in John 15:1-8?
- 6. Elijah thought he deserved better than what God was giving him. (I Kings 19:4) Do we really want God to give us what we deserve? List some of the blessings we receive every day that we don't deserve.
- 7. Elijah was zealous for God but may not have been walking closely with God. How do we live a Mary life in a Martha world? (Luke 10:38-42)
- 8. Elijah became isolated. (I Kings 19:10) He felt all alone. Maybe even abandoned. What can we do so that such isolation doesn't happen in our lives?
