- 2. Why are political ads, speeches, and communication built around fear and division?
- 3. What were the differences between a tax collector (Matthew) and a Zealot (Simon)?
- 4. Why is it notable that Jesus called two people to follow Him who were on opposite sides of the politics of their day?
- 5. What might this teach us about how we should engage people with different political perspectives than us?
- 6. Why did Jesus intentionally invite such different types of people to follow Him?
- 7. What was more important to Jesus than the potential tension that such differences might have caused?
- 8. How can followers of Jesus unite in spite of the human differences that divide us?
- 9. What did Jesus say are the greatest commandments of all (Matthew 22:36-40)? How are these two commandments connected to one another?
- 10. How might the Greatest Commandments affect our approach to disagreements with other people?
- 11. How did Jesus love His disciples? Based upon this, what did Jesus say would be the New Commandment (John 13:34-35)?
- 12. How might the New Commandment affect our approach to disagreements with other followers of Jesus?
- 13. How did Jesus say everyone will know we are His disciples?
- 14. Why is this important?
- 15. Why are there no excuses for choosing not to love others?
- 16. What are some ways that you can show love to those with whom you disagree politically?
